Yearbook

The purpose of the yearbook is to indicate when decisions have to be made by the Commission.

In accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association of SAL the Commission shall:

- foster, develop and control the sport of road and cross country running in Scotland;
- take responsibility for all road and cross country running teams representing Scotland;
- promote annual Championships and other competitions;
- establish and enforce rules for competition; and
- advance and safeguard the interests of road and cross country running in Scotland.

and states that the Commission shall meet not less than 3 times per year (Section 4).

At the moment the Commission meets 5 times in a year: February, May, August, September/October (soon after the SAL AGM) and December.

1 Appointment and Election of Commission Members

The membership of the Commission is defined in the Terms of Reference. The Convener and Secretary are appointed annually at the SAL Annual General Meeting. The District Representatives are elected by the Clubs in the District. The Championship Convener, Officials Co-ordinator, the athlete member and any other position are appointed by the Convener subject to the veto of the members of the RR&CCC.

The Memorandum and Articles of Association of SAL (5.1.1) state that the AGM shall except in exceptional circumstances be held no later than 30th September in each year. Nominations for the posts of Convener and Secretary must be made no later than 60 days before the AGM (3.5.1).

The role of each Commission member and their Term of Office is defined in the Terms of Reference.

2 Championships

2.1 Winter Championships

As per UKA Rule 141 S 1 the Commission operates with the Competition year start date of October 1st for Cross Country and 1st September for Road Running. Some UKA documents use the 1st of January as the year date but traditionally in Scotland and because of the AGM date it is prudent to use the Competition year date. The Winter Championships for which the Commission is responsible are as follows: Week 1 contains the 1st Saturday in October.
