SOUTHERN'S ALL ROUND STRENGTH DECISIVE

At Baillieston, Glasgow, October 25th

AFTER a race of fluctuating fortunes in which
the lead changed from lap to lap, the all
round strength of Edinburgh Southern Harriers
triumphed over the occasional flashes of individual brilliance from Edinburgh AC and enabled Southern to retain the "Allan Scally" 4 x 5
miles road relay trophy in the new record time
of 90:45, with Shettleston Harriers finishing an
isolated third.

Douglas Gunstone gave Edinburgh AC a lead of 35y from Ian Elliott and Bill Yates (23:00) gave Maryhill Harriers a momentary flash of prominence before they faded away to a final 25th place. Shettleston (D. Lang) were well down 25th place. Shettleston (D. Lang) were well down in 12th place and Alastair Hutton (ESH 'B') had a disasterous run of 26:33 in 41st place. Colin Youngson soon pulled in Danny Knowles and went on to establish a lead of 18sec. This lap was noticeable for many "rescue operations" after poor first lap performances—Lawrie Spence returned the second fastest lap of 22:12 when he lifted Strathclyde University from 19th to sixth, with his brother Cameron pulling in 18 places (32nd to 14th) for Spango Vallev AC. sixth, with his brother Cameron pulling in 18 places (32nd to 14th) for Spango Valley AC. Young Nat Muir (a first year Junior) gave Shettleston supporters a welcome lift when he ran 22:30 to bring his club home third, just in front of Alex Wight (EAC 'B') while Frank Clement, relaxing after a hard track season, turned in a "joy run" of 23:07 to pull his club up twelve places to night. up twelve places to ninth.

The third lap saw a repeat of the duel between David Logue and Andy McKean which highlighted the opening McAndrew Relays. McKean (the hunter) chased Logue (the hare) and steadily closed the 18sec gap over the first four miles, drawing level with a mile to go. Logue responded and they raced the final mile to the change-over neck and neck with McKean just getting the ned neck and neck with McKean just getting the nod on the line by a bare yard, recording the fastest lap of 22:02. Logue, though recording 22:20, was disappointed, saying "I'm sorry I started with a lead, I would much rather start level with Andy and then we'll see who is faster. It would be a different race then. I expect we'll meet on the long seven mile leg in the Edinburgh—Glasgow Relay and that will be a race and a half if we are within any reasonable dis-

tance of each other".

Ronnie Knowles had no change against Alastair Blamire who finished over 200y clear in 22:52 but was still 3sec slower than 'B' runner Gareth but was still 3sec slower than 'B' runner Gareth Bryan-Jones (22:49) who completed a remarkable recovery by ESH 'B' to finish seventh after improving on every lap after Hutton's first lap debacle. Strathclyde University repeated last year's victory in the Scottish University Relay Championship, held in conjunction with the open race, when they finished well clear of Edinburgh University and Glasgow University.
