Third Place For Shettleston Harriers

Wet and windy conditions did not dampen dampen the enthusiasm of the four hundred hardy runners who entered the twenty third annual 4 x 5 mile Allan Scally Road Relay at Baillieston on Saturday.

Alistair Hutton of Caledon Park Harriers, the 1990 London Marathon Winner led the field home at the first lap in atime of 22 minutes 22 seconds. Shettleston's Dermot McGonigal and John Mackay followed in sixth and eighth places respectively.

Racing Club of Edinburgh, running in their first race since dropping

Reebok sponsorship, moved into the lead on lap two when Brian Kirkwood finished tweleve seconds clear of Caledon Park's Ian Steele. David Cameron moved Shettleston's A team from eight up to fifth with a time of 23 minutes and 46 seconds.

John Robson of Racing Club, the Scottish 1500 metres record holder, produced the second fastest lap of the day to take his team to an unassailable lead of 88 seconds at the end of lap three.

Falkirk Victoria Harriers and Shettleston finished together in second and third behind Robson. A

personal best run by Billy Coyle of the local club gained three places for his team with the fourth fastest individual time of the day.

Racing Club's lead allowed Tom Hanlon to coast 'round the final leg and still lead his team to a new course record of 90 minutes 38 seconds. The fortunes over the past few weeks of the second and third runners could not have been more different. Nat Muir having had three of the past six weeks off training with injury and illness and John Sherban fresh from running the fastest lap in the English Six Stage Relay

Championships the previous weekend. Muir stayed with Sherban for the first mile, but realising he could not match the pace of the in form Englishman, settled for third place ahead of Caledon Park Harriers.

Falkirk based Sherban is

emerging as one of Britain's best distance runners and ran the fastest lap of the day. His time of 21 minutes 48 seconds in poor conditions being only 22 seconds slower than Nat Muirs 1985 lap record.

Allister Hutton made one of his rare appearances, led the field home on the opening lap in 22min, 22sec., and gave Caledon Park Harriers a 36sec lead from Alan Robson (Racing Club). Racing Club then went ahead, and from half distance the 12sec lead was extended by John Robson and Tom Hanlon with effortless ease to give the Edinburgh club a winning margin of almost 300 yards in a course record time of thr 30min.

Falkirk Victoria Harriers, only tenth after the first lap, recovered well and a final-lap run of 21min. 48sec.— the fastest of the day—by John Sherban put them in second position. The organising club, Shettleston Harriers, held on to third place, although Nat Muir was chased all the way by Afan Puckrin who gained 42sec. on the Shettleston runner to put Caledon Park into a close-up fourth position.

Edinburgh University continued the excellent form they have shown in recent crosscountry relay events and won the Scottish Universities' Relay Championship by a large margin from Strathclyde University.
