



SHETTLESTON'S BRILLIANT WIN AT HAMILTON.

SHETTLESTON HARRIERS must be heartily congratulated on their brilliant team victory in the seven-miles Midland District Cross-Country Championship at Hamilton. To place their counting six between the ninth and twentieth positions was team work of extraordinarily good class. The winning aggregate of 93 points was 36 better than that of the runners-up, Plebeian, and 59 better than that registered by Garscube, who were third.

The individual winner, D. Urquhart, Garscube, ran so well that he never looked like relinquishing his grip of the race after the end of the first lap. R. Clark, Plebeian, challenged for a while, but Urquhart gradually moved away from the field and raced home a winner by 220 yards from W. S. Fisher, West of Scotland, in the fine time of 42 mins. 39 3-5 secs. J. Shaw, Hamilton, who was not considered as a probable, gave a splendid exhibition to take third place.

Among those who disappointed were Motherwell Y.M.C.A., and particularly W. H. Gardiner, a favourite for the individual honour. Gardiner took the lead at the start, took a "stitch," and recovered ten places to finish eleventh.

SCOTS CUEISTS.

H. V. KING'S BIG WIN OVER TOM BLUE.

H. V. King, Neilston, scored a substantial victory over Thomas Blue, Glasgow, in their second round tie of the Scottish Amateur Billiards Championship, played in the Edinburgh Working Men's Club on Saturday. The feature of the afternoon session was a break of 107 by King, and at the interval the score stood: King, 501; Blue, 419.

An hour and ten minutes in the evening was sufficient to bring the game to an end, King almost monopolising the table. Best breaks: King, 107, 44, 66, 44, 62, and 48 (unfinished); Blue, 55, 65, and 45.

M'CONACHY DEFEATS LINDRUM.

Lindrum was unable to concede M'Conachy 3500 points in a week's billiards match, at Wolverhampton; in fact, he was beaten by a greater margin than the start he gave. The New Zealand winner on Saturday by 3721 points. Lindrum was overwhelmed in the final session, in which he scored only 143 against 1036. M'Conachy also had the better of matters in the afternoon, when he made breaks of 121, 102, and 260 (unfinished), as against Lindrum's 166 and 118.
