

CROSS COUNTRY TEAM RACE AT GLASGOW.—Under the auspices of the National Cross Country Union of Scotland, the annual team race championship of the Western District took place on Saturday, the starting and finishing points being Houston Glen Public Park, Glasgow. There was an entry of twenty teams, and all had the necessary complements for counting, twelve being the maximum and six the minimum. The course, which was over seven miles in length, lay by way of Whitecraigs Golf Course, across Old Stewarton Road, round Gorbals Waterworks, then through Darnley Shooting Range, and on to the Main Avenue and into Houston Glen. On leaving the park for the open country, Harris (Shettleston Harriers) led the field, closely followed by Kerr (Motherwell), Wright (Glydevale), and Williamson (Motherwell). On coming into the grounds at the finish, S. Small (Bellabouston) led the field, and finishing strongly was G.W. Macfarlane (the judge), D. Wright (Glydevale) finished second, J. Culbert (Garscube Harriers) third, with A. Semple (Shettleston Harriers) getting fourth place.
