14th November BARR'S EDINBURGH TO GLASGOW RELAY

LESLIE DEANS' Racing Club registered the biggest winning margin since 1960 when collecting the Edinburgh to Glasgow road relay title for the third year in a row, Fraser Clyne reports.

The Edinburgh outfit covered the 45 mile route in 3:45:33 to finish 4:09 ahead of 1990 winners Falkirk Victoria Harriers who were runners-up for the second year in succession.

Only Shettleston Harriers (1949 and 1960) and Victoria Park AAC (1952 and 1957) have enjoyed more comfortable winning cushions during the 53 previous editions of Scotland'sgreatest club relay race.

Leslie Deans' domination was reflected in the fact that it's runners recorded the fastest times on four of the eight stages.

Gary Grindlay gave Falkirk Victoria an early lead over Shettleston's David Cameron with Brian Kirkwood bringing the title holders through in third place less than 100yds behind

John Sherban maintained Falkirk's advantage on the tough second stage as Kilbarchan moved into second spot through Bobby Quinn while Leslie Deans' Davie Ross slipped back to fifth.

The turning point came on the third leg however when Scott Cohen powered Leslie

Deans into pole position with the fastest stage time, turning a 27sec deficit into a six seconds lead over Kilbarchan with Falkirk a further 27sec down in third spot.

lan Brown inflicted further damage on the opposition with the fastest fourth stage time as Leslie Deans stretched it's advantage to 38 seconds over Falkirk who had been hoisted back into second place by lan Johnstone.

Alan Robson, recently recovered from flu, added another 42sec to the lead on the next leg and his brother John put the champions in easy street with a blistering solo performance on the long sixth stage.

Frank McGowan ran an iso-

lated fastest seventh stage time while Peter Fleming showed he had recovered from his lifetime best marathon performance in the World Cup two weeks earlier by comfortable anchoring his side to victory.

No fewer than five of the winning team - Kirkwood, Ross, Cohen and the Robson brothers - have appeared in all three of Leslie Deans' E to G winning line-ups. Brown and Fleming were enjoying their second wins with McGowan being the only newcomer in the ranks.

Falkirk battled gamely to clinch the silver medals while a storming last stage run by Steven Wylie hoisted national cross country champions Cambuslang Harriers up from sixth to third.

Livingston and District AC picked up the most meritorious team award, improving from 12th last year to seventh on this occasion.

Only seventeen of the invited 21 teams completed the course. Springburn Harriers withdrew in the days leading up to the event after their team was devastated by an outbreak of flu.

BT Pitreavie, who only qualified following the National cross country relay championships in October, pulled out because of a clash with the Glen Clova half marathon. Fife AC failed to finish when it's last minute final stage substitute runner Doug Gunstone

pulled a muscle warming up.

Dumbarton AC also came unstuck when Billy Christie went drastically off course and ended up completing both the seventh and eighth stages after missing the final changeover point.

Edinburgh Southern Harriers and Irvine AC also suffered from marshalling inadequacies in the closing stages.

Thankfully however the race passed without serious incident despite being held without any police cover for much of the distance due to a decision by Lothian and Borders constabulary not to support the event

Race convener Brian
Goodwin appreciates nevertheless that a number of matters
require attention if the race is
to survive. A new route out of
Edinburgh is to be investigated
and the possibility of participating clubs each being required
to supply at least two marshalls, with a time penalty
imposed on those who fail to
so do, may be introduced.
